



Nearly 1 in 2 people are malnourished in some way







We need to **help businesses** do good things for nutrition (& less bad): that means **engaging**




Business can do no wrong


We need hybrid approaches to create demand for healthy food

Creative behavior change programs can have a large impact




% of children consuming diets that meet nutrient adequacy, 6-24 months of age



Goal of the EIP: to support inclusive and sustainable growth, creating jobs and contributing to address the root causes of migration.

Mobilising Investments

Examples from GAIN work

- Creating demand for nutritious foods through blends of private and public approaches
- Developing Deal Flows for investment bankers and venture capitalists in the production, distribution, processing and retailing of nutritious foods
- Leveraging private sector resources

Stepping Up TA

Examples from GAIN work

- Supporting development of business plans for nutritious foods that expand market share and lower price
- Supporting development of government nutrition plans that identify roles for the private sector

Improving the Business Environment

Examples from GAIN work

- Reducing import duties taxes on fortificants in Pakistan
- Reducing sales tax on processed milk in Ethiopia
- Promote diagnostics for where food systems are broken for healthy food
